Gas Leak Test


Gas connections on the heater are leak tested at the factory prior to shipment. A complete gas tightness check must be performed due to possible mishandling in shipment or excessive pressure being applied to the heater gas connections.

1.Make a soap solution of one part liquid detergent and one part water.



Make sure the control knob on the heater is off and the gas valve on the cylinder is off before mixing the soapy solution.

2.Turn on the gas bottle.




3. Apply the soap solution to the gas connections using a soft bristle brush.



Hose / Regulator connection



Regulator / Cylinder connection



Soap bubbles will appear if there is a gas leak. In case of a leak, turn off the gas supply. Tighen any leaking fittings, then turn the gas supply on and re-check.

If there is a leak anywhere on the gas cylinder, do not use the cylinder. Locate the leaking cylinder outdoors away from sources of ignition, then contact your local gas authority or cylinder exchange provider to arrange disposal.

Warning:

Do not operate the appliance until all gas leaks have been rectified. Never leak test while smoking.

- This patio heater is not for commercial use.
- Do not use the patio heater for indoors, as it may cause personal injury or property damage.
- Do not place articles on or against this appliance
- Do not use or store flammable materials near this appliance
- Do not spray aerosols in the vicinity of this appliance while it is in operation
- This outdoor heater is not intended to be installed on recreational vehicles and/or boats.
- Repair should be done by a qualified service person.
- Improper installation, adjustment, alteration can cause personal injury or property damage.
- Do not attempt to alter the unit in any manner.
- Never replace or substitute the regulator with any regulator other than the factory-suggested replacement.
- Do not store or use petrol or other flammable vapors or liquids in the heater unit.
- The whole gas system, hose, regulator, pilot or burner should be inspected for leaks or damage before use, and at least annually by a qualified service person.
- All leak tests should be done with a soap solution. Never use an open flame to check for leaks.
- Do not use the heater until all connections have been leak tested.
- Turn off the gas valve immediately if smell of gas is detected.
- Do not transport heater while it's operating.
- Do not move the heater after it has been turned off until the temperature has cooled down.
- Keep the ventilation opening of the cylinder enclosure free and clear of debris.
- Do not paint the radiant screen, control panel or top canopy reflector.
- Control compartment, burner and circulation air passageways of the heater must be kept clean. More frequent cleaning may be required as necessary.
- The gas cylinder should be turned off when the heater is not in use.
- Check the heater immediately if any of the following occurs:
 - -the heater does not reach temperature.

-the burner makes popping noise during use (a slight noise is normal when the burner is

extinguished).

-smell of gas in conjunction with extreme yellow tipping of the burner flames.

- The regulator/hose assembly must be located out of pathways where people may trip over it or in area where the hose will not be subject to accidental damage.
- Any guard or other protective device removed for servicing the heater must be replaced before operating the heater.
- Adults and children should stay away from high temperature surface to avoid burns or clothing ignition.
- Children should be carefully supervised when they are in the area of the heater.
- Clothing or other flammable materials should not be hung on the heater or placed on or near the heater.
- This appliance shall not be installed or used indoors
- If there is any evidence of excessive abrasion or wear, Or if the hose assembly is damaged do not operate the appliance until a replacement hose assembly has been obtained from your authorized service provider Ensure that the replacement hose assembly is as specified by the manufacturer.
- Due to radiant heat Certain materials or items may be seriously damaged if stored under or near this appliance while it is in operation.
- Remove any packaging/transit protection prior to operating this appliance.

How to connect and use the new LCC27 LPG Connection*

* Fitted to Australia delivered BBQs only.

Introduction

This product is fitted with the new LCC27 regulator connection*, recently introduced by the Australian Government.

Its easily identified by the large plastic hand wheel.

This new LCC27 regulator can only be fitted to an LPG cylinder with the new LCC27 valve, as shown right.

Its easily identified by the tall external threads.

If your LPG cylinder is not compatible, you can either exchange it or buy a new cylinder.

Benefits of the new LCC27 cylinder connection


- Gas will NOT flow out of the cylinder until you connect the LCC27 regulator, so it's a much safer connection.
- A built in excess flow device will limit the gas flow if the hose splits open.


How to connect the LCC27 regulator to an LPG Cylinder

Turn the hand wheel clockwise until the handwheel stops turning.

Open the cylinder valve and conduct the gas leak check using soapy water (as explained in this manual).

Troubleshooting the LCC27 Connection







Fault	Possible cause	Solution	
No gas flow	Hand wheel is not fully tightened	Tighten the hand wheel	
No gas flow	Excess flow device has activated accidentally. This can occur if a burner valve is open before connecting the regulator to the cylinder.	Ensure that none of the burner valves are open. Turn off the gas at the cylinder valve, unscrew the regulator, then reconnect.	

Heater Stand and Location

- The heater is for outdoor use only. Always ensure that adequate fresh air ventilation is provided.
- Always maintain proper clearance to combustible materials, i.e. top 480mm and sides 480mm minimum.
- Heater must be placed on level firm ground.
- Never operate heater in an explosive atmosphere like in areas where petrol or other flammable liquids or vapors are stored.
- This appliance shall only be used in an above ground open-air situation with natural ventilation, without stagnant areas, where gas leakage and products of combustion are rapidly dispersed by wind and natural convection.
- This appliance shall be used only in an outdoor area and shall not be used in a building, garage or any other enclosed area unless the enclosure meets the requirements outlined in this instruction manual.
- Any enclosure in which the appliance is used shall comply with one of the following:

An enclosure with walls on all sides, but at least one permanent opening at ground level and no overhead cover.

Within a partial enclosure that includes an overhead cover and no more than two walls. Within a partial enclosure that includes an overhead cover and more than two walls, the following shall apply:

• at least 25% of the total wall area is completely open, and


• at least 30% of the remaining wall area is open and unrestricted.


In the case of balconies, at least 20% of the total wall area shall be and remain open and unrestricted.


DIAGRAMMATICAL REPRESENTATIONS OF OUTDOOR AREAS


(Informative)

The following figures are diagrammatical representations of outdoor areas as described above. Rectangular areas have been used in these figures - the same principles apply to any other shaped area.









Gas Requirements

- Refer to the gas type label for confirmation of the gas type to be used with your appliance.
- Use only the pressure regulator and hose assembly supplied with this appliance.
- A dented, rusted or damaged gas cylinder may be hazardous and should be checked by your cylinder supplier. Never use a gas cylinder with a damaged valve connection.
- Never connect an unregulated gas cylinder to the heater.
- This appliance is NOT suitable for use with a fixed gas supply system. Use ONLY a 9kg gas cylinder.

Leakage Test


- Gas connections on the heater are leak tested at the factory prior to shipment. A complete gas tightness
 check must be performed due to possible mishandling in shipment or excessive pressure being applied to
 the heater.
- Make a soap solution of one part liquid detergent and one part water.
- The soap solution can be applied with a spray bottle, brush or rag. Soap bubbles will appear in case of a leak.
- The heater must be checked with a full cylinder.
- Make sure the safety control valve is in the OFF position.
- Apply the soap solution to the gas connections.
- Turn the gas supply ON.
- In case of a leak, turn off the gas supply. Tighten any leaking fittings, then turn the gas supply on and recheck.
- Do not operate the appliance until all gas leaks have been rectified.
- Never leak test while smoking.

Operation And Storage

TO TURN ON THE HEATER

- This heater uses a pilot to light the burner. The pilot burner is a very small burner next to the heater burner.
- 2. To light the heater, turn the control knob to the pilot position and keep the control knob depressed so gas can flow to the pilot burner. This can take up to 1 minute.






IGNITER

3. Activate the igniter button repeatedly until you see the blue flame of the pilot through the viewing hole in the mesh. The pilot flame can be difficult to see in direct sunlight.

TO TURN OFF THE HEATER


- 1. Turn the variable control knob to PILOT position.
- 2. Press and turn the variable control knob to OFF position.
- 3. Turn off the valve on the gas supply cylinder completely.



Variable Control knob


Storage

- 1. Always close the gas valve of the gas cylinder after use or in case of a disturbance.
- 2. Disconnect the regulator from the gas cylinder valve.
- 3. Check the tightness of the gas valve for damage. If you suspect damage, have it changed by your gas dealer.
- 4. Never store gas cylinders underground or in places without adequate air ventilation
- 5. There is no limitation on the storage of appliances indoors provided that the cylinder is removed from the appliance; and
- 6. Storage of an appliance indoors with the cylinder attached is only permitted if the size of the cylinder complies with AS/NZS 1596; otherwise cylinders must be stored outdoors in a well-ventilated area and out of reach of children.



- 5. Turn knob to the HI position to light the heater burner, then adjust the knob to the desired heat setting between HI & LO.
- 6. If the pilot will not stay alight, reset the tip over switch by tilting the heater 45°, then return the heater to upright.







Cleaning and Care

- Wipe off stainless steel surfaces with soft, moist rag. Do not clean heater with cleaners that are combustible or corrosive.
- Remove debris from the burner to keep it clean and safe for use.
- Cover the burner unit with the optional protective cover when the heater is not in use.

Assembly Parts and Procedures

Tools needed:

- Open end wrench 10 & 13 mm
- Adjustable opening wrench (2) 20 cm long
- Slip joint pliers 23 cm long
- Philips screwdriver w/ medium blade
- Spray bottle of soap solution for leakage test


Parts supplied:

- 6PCS M5 x 12 screw for stand and stand connectors
- 4pcs Self Taping Screws for burner head and tank housing body
- 4pcs M5X12 screw for tank housing body and stand
- M6 Dome Nut for safety guard and burner head
- Hose and regulator assembly

Assembly Steps


STEP 1

Use 6pcs M5X12 screw to join the stand and stand connectors.




STEP 2

Use 4pcs M5X12 screw to join the tank housing base and stand.




STEP 3

- 3-1. Hasp the second door locker and open the first one as shown in photos.
- 3-2. Use 4pcs Self Taping Screws join the burner head and tank housing body.




STEP 4

Use the M6 Dome Nut connect the two half safety guards to burner head.




STEP 5

- 5-1. Open the door of tank housing.
- 5-2. Attach the regulator to the gas cylinder and tighten with wrench if fitted with a nut, or tighten by hand if fitted with a hand wheel.
- 5-3. Unscrew the igniter button, then install the battery and tighten igniter button.



- 5-4. Then leak test the gas inlet and gas cylinder connections as explained on page 4.
- 5-5. Put the gas cylinder into the tank housing, then close the door.

Note: The ignitor is powered by a small battery, if the pilot can't be lighted, the problem may be the battery which is exhausted. Please replace the battery(DC 1.5V).



Pilot Service


The pilot burner should produce a small blue flame. If your pilot flame is very large or orange or the pilot flame comes out of the side holes, you need to service your pilot burner.

To service the pilot burner, remove the safety guard then remove the perforated emitter to access the pilot. Then insert a pipe cleaner into the air holes at the base of the pilot tube, and in the pilot burner tube as shown below to clear spider webs or nests.

Blow air through the pilot burner tube and through the air holes at the base of the pilot tube to clear the pilot burner of dead moths or bugs.

Don't poke wire or drills into the pilot burner to prevent damage to the precise gas jet inside the pilot tube.

A pilot blockage will prevent normal operation of your heater so regularly check your pilot.
