PLASTER OF PARIS

Directions for use

- Make sure your project is properly laid out with all the necessary tools at hand.
- Pour water into a mixing container or bucket (one 2.5kg bag requires approximately 1.5-1.75 litres of clean water).
- Always add the plaster to the water (do not add the water to the plaster) and sprinkle in the plaster a bit at a time.
- Gently mix the plaster from side to side until it reaches a uniform and smooth consistency.

Handy Hints

- Avoid creating and breathing in plaster dust.
- Clean tools immediately after use with water

Safety



Risk

- Mixing Plaster of Paris may be irritating to the eyes and skin.
- Prolonged exposure to Plaster of Paris may cause dermatitis and alkaline burns.
- Plaster of Paris dust is irritating to the eyes and skin and respiratory system.
- Repeated inhalation may increase bronchitis and silicosis.
- Crystalline silica is a known carcinogen.

Safety

- Avoid contact with eyes and skin with wet and dry Plaster of Paris.
- Wear suitable protective clothing including gloves and eye protection.
- Wear a suitable dust mask when handling cement or concrete, do not breathe in dust.
- Cutting concrete, keep it wet with water to avoid hazardous dust.

First Aid

- In the event of skin irritation wash with clean water.
- If dust gets into eyes wash immediately with eye wash solution or clean water.
- If symptoms persist seek medical advice.

Danger

- Causes mild skin irritation.
- May cause respiratory irritation.
- May cause serious eye damage.
- May cause damage to lungs and respiratory problems through prolonged or repeated inhalation.
