


# **WARNING**

To avoid creating a possible strangulation hazard for children, the corded internal window covering must be installed in such a way that a loose cord cannot form a loop 220mm or longer at a height of less than 1600mm above floor level.

A cord guide may be installed lower than 1600mm above floor level if the cord is sufficiently secured or tensioned to prevent a loop 220mm or longer from being formed. If a cord guide is installed lower than 1600mm above floor level it must be designed to prevent a child from being able to remove the cord.


If a cleat is used to secure the cord it must be at least 1600mm above floor level because a child is capable of unwinding a cord from a cleat.

# **Components List**



Before installation, check to ensure all blind parts are present.

- A: Roller Blind
- **B:** Bracket (for chain mechanism)
- C: Chain mechanism
- D: Idler end
- E: Bracket (for idler end)
- F: Tension device
- G: Screws
- H: Plaster Plugs
- I: Chain Joiner



FITTING TO BRICK OR METAL DEPENDING ON YOUR SPECIFIC APPLICATION/LOCATION


Screws **(G)** have been provided for fixing brackets to architrave or timber frame.

If fitting to plaster, use Plugs **(H)** provided.

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# **Installation** Options

#### **FACE MOUNT**




Face Mounted blinds are fixed to either: Architrave, Lintel/Wall or ceiling above the window frame. Measure width to cover opening as shown above.

#### **RECESS MOUNT**



**Recess Mounted** blinds are fixed inside the window frame. Measure width to fill opening as shown above.

## **FABRIC ROLL DIRECTION**




The default roll direction is 'front roll'. Ensure to install the blind with the bottom rail rubber facing the window. For a 'back roll' blind, flip the entire roller tube or re-roll the blind backwards.

## **OPERATION SIDE**



The Chain Operation can be swapped from either left or right side depending on your application/location.


# **Installation** Instructions

## NOTE ONE

Always measure and mark level bracket positions before pre-drilling pilot holes.

Before securing bracket, determine which side will have the chain mechanism operation and secure with bracket (B).

# STEP 1 FACE MOUNT




Secure to Architrave or Wall as shown above using screws provided. Use plaster plugs if fixing to wall.

#### NOTE TWO


Alternate fixings are required if fitting to brick or metal depending on your specific application/location.


# STEP 1 RECESS MOUNT



Slide bracket cover off to expose screw holes. Discard Cover. Secure inside window frame as shown above using screws provided.

# STEP 1 TOP MOUNT





NOTE THREE


Ceiling mount must be fixed to joist/beam. Failure to do so could result in damage and/ or injury.

Secure to top of window frame or to ceiling as shown.


# STEP 2 INSERT BLIND



Insert chain mechanism **(C)** into the desired side of roller tube. Insert idler end **(D)** into the opposite end.


Insert blind into brackets: starting from the side with chain mechanism (C), insert into bracket (B). Then slide the idler end into bracket (E).

# **A** WARNING




To avoid creating a possible strangulation hazard for children, the corded internal window covering must be installed in such a way that a loose cord cannot form a loop 220mm or longer at a height of less than 1600mm above floor level.

# STEP 3 INSTALL SAFETY DEVICE



Lightly tension ball chain and fit tension device securely to architrave/wall. Allow enough play for chain to pass through device freely.

## **OPERATION**



Gently pull on the ball chain to raise or lower your blind to any height.

# **Maintenance**


#### **BLIND REMOVAL**



Idler Pin mechanisms have a special feature allowing the pin to be wound in/out for easy blind removal and access to window for cleaning, painting or maintenance.

Twist clear wheel of Idler end **(D)** to release the blind from bracket.


#### **CLEANING**



Dust periodically. Use warm soapy water (gentle/mild laundry detergent) and soft cloth to clean if required.

Avoid using harsh chemical as it can damage fabric coating.

## SHORTENING CHAIN LENGTH




To shorten current roller blind chain:

- Cut excess chain using scissors\*
- Place the last bead from the chain into the ball slot of one half of the chain joiner
  - Repeat for the other half of chain joiner
  - Clip the two halves together, you should now have a complete chain loop.

#### NOTE

\*Measure the desired length of chain carefully. Once chain joiner is in place, it will NOT be able to pass through the chain mechanism.






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
# **Troubleshooting** Instructions

#### CREASING



If there are creasing marks on the blind, try to fully extend the blind down as much as possible and creasing should subside after about 2-4 weeks. The weight of the bottom rail will help flatten out the fabric.

## **FABRIC ROLL DIRECTION**



Ensure the blind is installed with the bottom rail rubber facing the window.

#### To reverse the blind for 'back roll' installation

- 1. Roll the blind all the way to the bottom until you see the exposed tube at the top
- 2. Then keep rolling in the same direction to wind fabric back up
  - 3. The roll direction is now 'back roll'




As the blind has been tightly rolled for a period of time, the fabric could be slightly warped on the tube when winding the opposite direction. This will flatten over time.
