

# **Duratac Installation Instructions**

## **Installation of Duratac Hazard/Directional Tiles**

Do not install Tactile tiles directly onto the following surfaces:

- Asphalt
- Exposed aggregate concrete
- Concrete that is less than 14 days old

For these surfaces, use Selleys Kwik Grip Spray Adhesive. Please follow the instructions below for using this adhesive.

#### Steps for Installation on Stone, Timber or Concrete (that is more than 14 Days old):

- Ensure the surface is dry and free from dust. Use acetone to clean the surface thoroughly, making sure to remove any excess acetone before proceeding.
- 2. Peel the backing off the Tactile tile and place it in the desired position.

#### **Installation Using Selleys Kwik Grip Spray Adhesive:**

- 1. Ensure the area is free from dust.
- 2. Use masking tape to outline the area where the adhesive will be applied.
- 3. Spray the entire masked-off area with Selleys Kwik Grip Spray Adhesive.
- 4. Once the adhesive is dry, remove the masking tape. Proceed with installing the Tactile tiles according to the standard installation instructions above.

### Tips for a Successful Installation:

To prevent water from pooling behind the Fastiles (which can cause pedestrians to get wet feet and result in the tiles lifting over time), follow these recommendations:

- Leave a gap of approximately 1-2mm between the tiles and any adjacent walls or curbs.
- For areas where the Tactile tiles cover more than 3 meters in length, create
  a break at a handrail (as tiles only need to cover the width of the travel
  path). If no handrail is available within 3 meters, leave a 5mm gap between
  tiles every 3 meters.

By following these guidelines, you'll ensure a more durable and long-lasting installation
