Rolph Watson – Counties Manukau

Since first playing the game, Rolph has dedicated his time to giving back to the sport he loves. He started out as a player and then moved on to become a coach, referee, administrator, supporter and mentor at Pukekohe Touch. His contribution has helped to grow his Touch module in the Counties region.

Murray Ivory - Waikato

Known as Waikato's Touch patriarch, Murray has performed various roles for his local Touch module, stepping in to help when required, including coach, referee, field marker and sideline supporter. During his tenure, Murray has shaped four generations of players, working tirelessly to ensure local tamariki have access to play the sport he loves. He has developed the largest school Touch module in the region and has helped to produce national representatives in various rugby codes.

Vatau Sagaga - Wellington

A humble but mighty advocate for Wainuiomata Touch, Vatau lives the values of his club, championing accessibility and affordability of sport in his community. He has created opportunities for local tamariki to enjoy Touch without limitation, which has resulted in huge growth in participation and a thriving Touch module in the region.

Hoani Smith - Wellington

Hoani, aka "The Touch Man", is dedicated to developing youth Touch players in Naenae. He's committed to ensuring that kids playing Touch in his community can get access to games and tournaments and spends countless hours and effort fundraising to make this possible. He's created a safe and caring environment for kids to learn the game and have fun, fostering respect, effort and teamwork.

Jason Watene - Canterbury

A local legend and role model, Jason has been influential in growing Touch in his rural community of Methven. He holds many roles from coaching, painting the fields, pumping up balls and organising kits for referees. He dedicates his time to the sport so that others can enjoy it and benefit from it. His passion for Touch, paired with his knowledge and enthusiasm have all been instrumental in creating a thriving Touch module in the region.
