	During warmer weather you may find you need to treat and control any pests and diseases more often. Identify your problem and select a suitable pesticide or fungicide. 	FEBRUARY	AUGUST
	Treat with lawn soil booster to improve soil health and help the lawn to cope with varying weather conditions, pests and diseases	Use a fertiliser to boost the growth rate and colour of your lawn

	Scarify your lawn to remove thatch, moss and other undesirable organic matter	Apply a wetting agent to encourage deeper roots and deep watering. This means you'll water longer, but less often, unless you're establishing a new lawn
	JUNE	Increase watering with the warmer weather starting
	Use a suitable fertiliser to improve the colour of your lawn	to come through. Be sure to abide by any watering restrictions in your local council
